History

Aqua Illinois, Inc. dates to 1886 when the formation of a public water supply corporation was authorized by the Common Council of the City of Kankakee. The predecessor to the present corporation, Kankakee Water Company, was formed in 1910. The Danville Water Company was formed in 1883 to serve the City of Danville and became Inter-State Water Company in 1913 until it was sold in 1986 to Consumers Water Company.

In its early years, Kankakee Water Company constructed one of the first water filtration plants in the Midwest. Throughout the years since the company was founded, a number of acquisitions were made, expanding the company from the City of Kankakee to other communities in central and northern Illinois. As of 2012, Aqua serves customers in 47 communities in central and northern Illinois.

In 1988, the name of company was changed to Consumers Illinois Water Company. In 1999, a merger between Philadelphia Suburban Corporation (PSC) and Consumers Water Company (CWC) was approved by the Illinois Commerce Commission. Accordingly, CWC became a wholly-owned subsidiary of PSC. In 2003, PSC announced plans to change its name to Aqua America, Inc. As a result, Aqua America's various subsidiaries changed their names, and Consumers Illinois Water Company became Aqua Illinois, Inc. on January 16, 2004.

Aqua Illinois is a subsidiary of Aqua America, Inc., (NYSE: WTR) one of the nation's largest publicly-traded water utilities. Aqua America is a Pennsylvania corporation with offices in Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania.
